The Arc's Policy in Action

We have a comprehensive three-pronged plan - to lead the fight for inclusion and opportunity, build a nation-wide movement, and create practical solutions to empower people to live their best lives - designed to promote and protect the rights of people with I/DD at every stage of life.

With your support, the most immediate goals within our plan can be successfully accomplished:



Protect essential programs (e.g. Medicaid, Affordable Care Act, Medicare, SSI and Social Security) from budget cuts and other changes which will hurt people with I/DD and their families and prevent efforts to weaken civil rights laws, including the Americans with Disabilities Act.



Build a powerful online disability rights movement which effectively organizes and mobilizes people and money in support of people with I/DD and their families.



Capitalize on the collective knowledge of our chapters to expand the range and improve the quality and accessibility of services and supports for people with I/DD, including programs such as The Center for Future Planning, the National Center on Criminal Justice and Disability, and The Arc@Work.

Ricardo's Story



Ricardo had big hopes and dreams, but as is too often experienced by many people with I/DD, they seemed impossible. Determined to live independently in his community, he fought

for the right to leave the institution where he grew up. Tenacious in his quest for independence, he has worked at the Martin Luther King Library in downtown DC for 40 years. He and his childhood friend Donna, who he met at the institution and who recently retired from Walter Reed Medical Center, visited each other frequently and their friendship soon blossomed into romance.

At a time when few individuals with I/DD lived independently like everyone else, they married and had a son. The Arc offered support to both of them throughout their journey, enabling him and Donna to live life on their own terms. Ricardo and his wife Donna remain vocal self-advocates, and have testified before Congress, "I've seen people with severe disabilities who have grown and accomplished great things given the right support."

The Power of The Arc's Advocacy

People with I/DD and their families fully embrace The Arc as the only nation-wide organization where they can go for advocacy, services, and supports. The Arc has been instrumental in the passage of every major piece of federal legislation impacting people with I/DD. Here are just a few:
